Like all people who leave home, he surely asked himself, "What Shall I Do Now?"

Joseph adapted to new circumstances with God's help. Things were very different for him as Potiphar's slave in Egypt. Instead of mourning his circumstances, Joseph adapted. He surveyed his circumstances and began to do the best he could to make a positive life for himself in those circumstances. That is what each of us should do. Circumstances always change. With God's help we can serve him in any circumstance.

Joseph began to work responsibly and earn the trust of people around him. God wants all of us to work for a living and to be trustworthy people. He wants his people to be productive and earn their way in society. When you leave home, you will have work to do, both in school and in the world of gainful employment. If you set your mind to work well, act responsibly, and earn trust, many doors will open for you and you will have great opportunities. People who are responsible and trustworthy are a valuable commodity both in secular and spiritual life.

Joseph acted morally, even in difficult circumstances. He had made up his mind to try to do what was right, no matter what, and God blessed him for it. He refused the advances of Potiphar's wife, and he told the truth to the but-

Joseph lived in a disciplined manner in order to accomplish his goals. People who are undisciplined with their money, their time, their rest, their work, or their studies, accomplish much less, and only hurt themselves. Joseph was disciplined in all of these areas, and proved himself able to plan and ration the resources of the nation of Egypt during

prosperous times, to the point that he carried them through a great famine as well. Disciplined people are successful people in both the secular and the spiritual realms.

Joseph used his power, his position, and his resources to accomplish good things. He was able to save his people from extinction, to lift the Egyptian nation in a time of disaster, and to accomplish reconciliation in his family. God gave him power, responsibility, and position, and he used all of those things unselfishly and for the good of others. God may give you power, position, and resources. Will you use them for good like Joseph did?

What will you do now that you have reached this milestone in your life? If you will let God help you adapt to any circumstance... if you will work responsibly and earn the trust of others... if you will act morally and with integrity... if you will discipline your time, your resources, and work efforts... and if you will use the power and resources God gives you for good purposes, God will bless your life and use you for great things!
